

**I** had a hard time writing director's notes for this play. I think it is because this is not just a story about a woman yearning to return to her family home. It is a recognition that while life is fleeting, and often disappointing, it is equally or even more so beautiful, when you consider the complex richness involved in simply "living".

Our stories and experiences, good and bad, shape who we are and how we interact with the world around us. We are ever changing. This play reminds us that the past cannot be replicated, but cherished.

Reuniting and revisiting memories and moments in time when nostalgia arises — through sounds, smells, visual memories, and the stories we share — is a gift. Nothing we've experienced ever goes away. And I am grateful for that. Let us gain strength and dignity from our own truths. "We left it, but we can never lose what it has given us."

#### **ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT**



Horton Foote was born in Wharton, Texas, in 1916. He moved to California, where he studied theater at the Pasadena Playhouse in 1931–32. He began his career as an actor, but was also writing plays, and after getting better reviews for his plays than for his acting, focused on writing.

He became a leading writer for American television in the 1950s. He wrote many stage plays, screenplays and television scripts. His play *The Young Man from Atlanta* won the 1995 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, and his nine-play *Orphan's Home Cycle* won a special *Drama Desk Award*. He is also notable for writing the screenplay for *To Kill a Mockingbird*, which won an *Academy Award*.

**Foote died in 2009 in Hartford, Connecticut.** 



#### **ABOUT THE PLAY**

The Tip to Bountiful was originally written for NBC-TV and premiered March 1, 1953 before being produced for Broadway from November 3, 1953 – December 5, 1953.

He is just an actor in the play you are about to watch, are currently watching or have watched and are reading this on the way home.


He went to school for acting and on occasion he gets to do it.

Catherine Mary Sossi — Catherine Mary is delighted to appear in her first play with Domino.


She studied acting at York University, and singing, piano and music theory at Toronto's Royal Conservatory of Music.

Kate Barker — Kate is a journalist, playwright, poet and writer who recently moved back to Kingston.


She is delighted to be returning to the stage after almost 30 years.

Lynn Kerr — Lynn took up acting about 8 years ago.


This is her 4th show with Domino (most recently she was "Emma" in *Over the River and Through the Woods*).

She discovered a whole room full of costumes ... not just a dress-up box; Anne hopes she gets to wear a wig next time 'round.


She's ecstatic to be on stage with such a talented and fun cast.
